Dear Parishioners,

On this second Sunday of Lent with Lent still stretching out ahead of us for some time, we hear about the Transfiguration of Jesus, this year from St. Mark's Gospel. Peter has just made his great profession of faith and then Jesus starts to explain what it is for him to be the "Christ" and how he is going to suffer grievously, be rejected, put to death and rise on the third day. Peter cannot take this and starts arguing with him "not so, Lord". Then Jesus says those chilling words to him "Get behind me Satan! Because the way you think is not God's way, but man's". Satan was getting a wedge in between Peter's will and God's will, something he is to try to do unsuccessfully with Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus goes on to teach his disciples that if anyone wants to be his follower he must renounce himself, take up his cross and follow him. This is not easy stuff. Although we are familiar with these words, we bulk at rejection, suffering and death as some thing we must do. Now Jesus wants to give his disciples some encouragement to keep them going. He allows Peter, James and John to see him with Elijah & Moses and to hear the voice of the Father saying of Jesus "listen to him".

God gives us encouragement when we really need it. I wonder why it was only those three disciples who were vouchsafed this extraordinary experience. Perhaps it was because he doesn't want us to be pursuing extraordinary spiritual experiences. We can so easily substitute such experiences in the place of God. Jesus wants us each to have a profound relationship with God. The other disciples received their encouragement indirectly through Peter, James & John. We normally receive the encouragement we need to follow Jesus from those around us, from other disciples. It is good to remember that. Spectacular religious experiences are not needed to be a faithful follower of Christ, but obedience to the Word of God.

In all three of the synoptic Gospels the account of the Transfiguration is very similar. One small difference in St. Mark's Gospel is its emphasis on the whiteness of Jesus' clothes rather than some supernatural brightness emanating from Jesus. Bear that in mind and look out for someone wearing white clothes as we continue the Gospel.

I also attach some Stations of the Cross which you might like to use at home either individually or better as a family. We traditionally do these devotions in Lent.
