Dear Parishioners.

This week, in addition to St.Patrick's Day on Wednesday we have the Solemnity of St. Joseph, husband of Mary and Patron of the Universal Church on Friday. This year has been designated the Year of St. Joseph so it is extra special this year in addition to him being patron of our Church in Nechells, so do try to get to Mass or if it is not possible to attend somewhere on-line. It is a Friday this year but since it is a Solemnity, this Friday is not a Day of Abstinence. You can eat meat!

This Sunday is mid-Lent Sunday often called Laetare Sunday or Refreshment Sunday and gives us a little "let up" from our Lenten austerities before we go into the second half and Holy Week.

We need to be thinking seriously about our Easter Confession. For many people it has been a long time since there last Confession amongst other things because of the difficulties caused by Covid. We still cannot use the Confessional so I shall be available for Confessions downstairs after Mass on Saturdays and Sundays at Sacred Heart where we can be socially distanced. If that is difficult for you, phone me and make a special appointment.

We are getting the rules for keeping Holy Week. The good thing is that we can keep it publicly this year, but the ceremonies will be greatly simplified and much shorter than usual without any processions or the Maundy Thursday watch.

The Archbishop is giving us a Pastoral letter this weekend, so let me give a short reflection of the Gospel here. It is John 3:14-21. Nicodemus has come to Jesus by night. This may be because he is afraid, but at another level it may indicate something which was common for Rabbis with their disciples when they wanted to talk to them about the most holy things. One to one at night signified the most holy of all. Therefore we are being allowed to listen in on something really important. Jesus in the earlier part of the chapter starts by saying that unless one is born again by water and the Holy Spirit one cannot see the Kingdom of God. Nicodemus, a teacher of Israel, interprets this literally. How can a man enter his mother's womb and be born a second time? Jesus gradually moves him onto heavenly things, to look "up" to the Son of Man "lifted up" as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness and then he moves on to what is perhaps the best known verse in the Bible, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever

believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." It is by looking at Jesus lifted up on the Cross that that we come to know God's judgement. As we do that we are able to come out of the darkness into the light. "Whoever does what is true comes to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that his works have been carried out in God." It is through our good works that we witness to truth, and are truly disciples of Christ. All our Christian life is a response to the love of God for us and for the whole world. With that confidence we can acknowledge our sins and so draw closer to him.
