Dear Parishioners,

We now enter our most Holy Week when we follow our Lord through his passion, his death on the cross, his burial and his resurrection from the dead. This is called the Paschal Mystery of our salvation and it is what Jesus came to do, and through it set up his One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church. This is one single event but in three "acts" and it is the most important part of our religious observance to attend it all. We became members of the Church through the waters of baptism. Traditionally the Easter Vigil is the time when people are baptised, but it is also the time when we reaffirm our baptismal promises. In fact the whole of Lent has been to prepare ourselves to make a deeper commitment this year than we have ever done before. An important part of this preparation is making our confession before we make our Easter Communion.

I hope that this past Covid year, for all its restrictions, has actually in some ways been instrumental in bringing us closer to Christ. We look forward when restrictions are lifted to being able to celebrate this personal renewal as also a corporate renewal, for none of us are saved alone, but saved "in Christ" united together in "koinonia" or fellowship.

The Liturgy of the Easter Triduum is very powerful. We just need to come with open hearts and minds and let it do its work. To let God be God and have that right "dominion" over us so that we become his servants, obedient to him.

I hope most of you will be able to attend live in Church, but for those for whom it is not safe then you are asked to attend on-line with the Archbishop at St. Chad's Cathedral because this is a time to be close to our Bishop. Go to the Cathedral website for details.

May God bless you all through dying to self and rising with Christ. May he keep you safe for eternal life, and, keep praying for one another.
