Today we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This completes the Christmas season and from Monday we begin the weeks in Ordinary Time. The green vestments come out once again for a few weeks until we begin Lent on Ash Wednesday, which this year comes on 22nd February. Green, a sign of hope, persistence, and continuing listening, is the most utilized colour at Sunday Masses and weekdays outside of declared festivals. It walks alongside priests and the faithful who turn to them on a daily basis. Green is the traditional colour for "Ordinary Time," the period between Easter and Christmas, and vice versa. It is supposed to express the expectation and hope in Christ's resurrection. Green represents the optimism and life that each new day brings.

Mass Intentions: Masses can be offered for anyone and for any intention. If you would like to have a Mass said for anyone then please complete a Mass Intention Request Envelope. These are kept at the back of the Church. You can choose to book your dates far into the future, so to secure a special date or anniversary, please let Father know.
